"I have learned over the years that when one's mind is made up, this diminishes fear, knowing what must be done does away with fear." Rosa Parks

One day in December of 1955, a little less that five years before I was born, three individuals took a seat on a bus in Montgomery, Alabama in seats in which they were not allowed to sit. When the bus driver demanded that they arise and relinquish the seats, only two responded as was expected. The other, a tired woman, refused. Perhaps it was partly to do with the fatigue of a long day's manual labor, but mostly it was due to a fatigue that had been growing ever since she was old enough to see the injustice around her. She put it this way:

"As far back as I can remember, I knew there was something wrong with our way of life when people could be mistreated because of the color of their skin."

Rosa Parks made up her mind to never give in again. She had made up her mind and fear was diminished. Her beliefs had moved her to action. You see the truth is that this one woman's principled action on a belief she knew to be true, that all men were created equal in the eyes of God, not only moved her to action but helped many others to find their courage as well. And just the other day, I learned that Rosa Parks attended the church of a young preacher by the name of Martin Luther King Jr.

While Martin Luther King Jr. would go on to be known as the voice behind the civil rights movement, Rosa Parks was the catalyst. In fact, in his memoir, Stride Toward Freedom, Martin Luther King Jr. wrote that it was Rosa Parks character and dedication that made her widely respected in the African American Community.

Suddenly, I am overwhelmed with a great gratitude to be among the family of faith here at Franklin United Methodist Church. Your work, to make a difference through actions of kindness and compassion, are a great inspiration and they are a motivation to me. They move me to seek ways to give a stronger voice to your desires to fight injustice. They move me to be a part of the works of mercy, which you have already begun and those you have yet to dream. They spark my imagination and I, too, begin to dream of ways this mission field can grow and expand with the love of God. And I can say with great conviction that it is your character and dedication that make you respected in this mission field of Franklin, Texas and I am glad to serve along side each of you.

Service at 6:30 p.m. and will include Holy Communion as we focus on the death of our Lord.


<u>April 21</u> Easter Sunday
