# **POLLY'S PONDERING**

#### Does the Great Commission Still Matter? And If So How Do We Live It Out?

It has been awhile ago now that I was sitting at a lunch when I heard a minister state that he wasn't into all that evangelism: talking to people about God stuff. It wasn't his strength. Unfortunately, his statement might be the epitome of the Barna Research study entitled: <u>Sharing Faith Is Increasingly</u> <u>Optional to Christians.</u>

According to the study, 86% of the people polled disagreed with the statement that "Converting people to Christianity is the job of the local church". However, 89% agreed that "Every Christian has a responsibility to share his/her faith." This is an interesting contradiction in and of itself since the local church is a collection of individual Christians. Today, even the percentage of those who believe that individual Christians are responsible for sharing their faith has dropped to 64%.

But, there is some upside to the study as well. Today, the study shows that faith-sharers are less likely to use scripture quoting as a form of conversion and they are less controversial in their approach; seeking sharing faith stories rather than challenging the other person to defend his/her faith. The study also stated that those who agree with faith-sharing understand that it is most effective when it is done with those whom they already have a relationship with.

You might be asking me why does all this matter? Well, it matters because your faith journey is a vital part of who you are. And it helps to shape your decisions, thoughts, and beliefs. To not talk about your faith story is to deny a voice to a large part of who you are. It also means that you are not giving a voice to a very important aspect in strengthening relationships with whom you share life's journey. Sharing faith stories in love and compassion allows us to enter into a deeper relationship and gain a greater understanding of others. Those shared stories help us to see how God is moving in the world. How faith has sustained ourselves and others in difficult and even dark times. In our shared expressions of faith, we are trusting others with a vital part of ourselves and we are inviting them to share part of themselves with us. Sharing our faith allows the Holy Spirit to work in and through our lives to shape us and to shape those who hear our story of faith.

In Matthew 28:18-20, Jesus tells his Disciples, "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you; and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen". Sometimes we translate that command – Go into all the world and *make* disciples. The difficulty here is that some take the command of God and use it as a power tool for forcing others into the faith. And, of course, that has never been the desire of God. He did not send Jesus to condemn the world and so neither would Jesus send us to condemn others. Jesus told us about his relationship with God, and about God's relationship with the world. He pointed out truth and used everyday visuals to do so. He took care of people in need and greatly desired to sit down with those who would invite him in. We, too, are invited to share our story, and to share the story of the Bible, so that others might hear and be moved to choose faith. We, too, are invited to meet the needs of others and to exhibit the compassion and love of God. We do all this with the hope that others will see God's continual unrelenting love for humanity and to see His indescribable mercy extended to all. We do this because our Lord and Savior has asked us to do so, and we do it because the love of God towards us and our love for God compels us to do so. We do this because the hope that we find through faith carries us through the ups and downs of life and we can't image living without that hope. We do it because there is a world of people who have no hope and it breaks out hearts each time that hopelessness reveals itself it horrific ways and at the expense of innocent lives. We will continue to do it no matter what small percentage of others choose to join us because our hope tells us there is a better day coming when there will be no more tears. What a day of rejoicing that will be!






