POLLY'S PONDERING: THE REST OF THE STORY

Yesterday in worship we were asked to pray for a young man named Chad. He is attending the same mission outreach school as Katie Kamas. The request asked us to pray for him because of the recent loss of his parents in a fire.

When I was in sixth grade I had a bicycle accident which ended me in the hospital with a broken jaw. I lay there with my teeth wired shut and my chin stitched up. I had plenty of time to think about the words of the doctor who said that "another ¼ of an inch and I would have been dead." Not the best bedside manner. Thoughts swirled. I did not have a background of faith tradition to pull from. In fact, other than my grandfather's funeral just a year or so earlier, I can't remember anything faith related.

My pain was not too bad, especially if I didn't try to laugh. But, my discomfort was really high. It had nothing to do with me and everything to do with the boy across the hall. He was on the children's wing as this was long before specialty burn units. I heard his suffering before I heard the explanation.

"Stop, you're tearing my skin!"

The sound of his cry was so penetrating. It reached right into my heart and into my mind and has stayed with me through time. So, Sunday when we talked about the two families that had experienced loss by fire, I was immediately transported back to the room across the hall from the boy whose cabin hot water tank had exploded. I often wonder about him, his recovery, his relationship with God.

Others were worried about Chad as well. He was in the hospital recovering from a broken bone, when the news of his parent's death reached the leaders. A few of them went together ready to share the news and to minister to Chad. What they didn't expect was Chad to minister to them. Upon hearing the news Chad asked if they could worship, right there, right then. In the midst of his pain and the grief-filled circumstance, Chad wanted – needed – to worship.

One of the earliest converts to Christianity, Paul, wrote these words, now recorded in Philippians Chapter 4:10-13.

"I rejoiced greatly in the Lord that at last you renewed your concern for me. Indeed, you were concerned but you had no opportunity to show it. I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through Him who gives me strength. Yet it was good of you to share in my troubles."

It is clear to me that Chad, not only knows this scripture, but has taken it into his heart. It has become part of who he is. And he is living it. Imagine yourself standing there ready to minister to one who is truly in grief only to find that you are the one to whom ministry is being given. Let us continue to join Chad in prayer as he acknowledged the God who gives and takes away, but who always is worthy of our praise. And let us agree with Chad, that he can do all things through Christ who gives him strength."

And the rest of the story, will be ours to learn, to tell, and to live. See you all Sunday as we worship the One who is indeed worthy of our praise.


