This new Sermon series "Living a Thankful Life," has got me to thinking about gratitude. I was walking through my laundry room past the coat rack that hangs there and my mind paused. "There are only two of us living here yet look at the number of jackets hanging on these hooks. Have I ever been truly thankful for the warmth and protection they provide? Or has that simply become something I expect." Sunday, we shared with the congregation the need to purchase about 25 coats for children in need. Children, for whom a coat is not a given. I think I will call the church office right now and put my name next to a coat as a tangible expression of my gratitude for the blessing of clothing.

Then I picked up the vacuum and began sweeping the floors and rugs. Again, my mind took me to a place of gratitude. "Look at this solid foundation under my feet. Each morning I wake and put my feet on the floor. How many people around the world have no solid flooring? How many people worry about the stability of their home, both the physical structure and the relationship of the people living within the house?" This year John and I celebrate 41 years of marriage in our solidly built home. Our home is built on our mutual love and faith in Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. And I am grateful for that amazing foundation for ourselves and our family. Today, I think I will say a special prayer asking God to move profoundly in the lives of my children, grandchildren and friends to provide a strong foundation for their future, to increase their faith, and to fill their hearts with gratitude. As I vacuum the floors, I will lift my voice in prayer as a gift of thanksgiving.

When I finished vacuuming and sat for a minute in front of the TV I heard a conversation about the escalating costs of food and gas. I thought to myself, "how many people will struggle now to put food on their table right here in Franklin, Texas?" Then I remembered Laura Corn saying the food pantry wanted to give out Turkeys in November. That is a perfect way for me to thank God for the abundance on my own table. Maybe you would like to join me?

The truth is that when you begin to intentionally live a thankful life you begin to see the blessings that are all around you. An article in Forbes lists 8 ways to live thankfully:

- 1. Don't be picky: appreciate everything.
- 2. Find gratitude in your challenges. (Remember the phrase that which does not kill us makes us stronger).
- 3. Practice mindfulness. (Be present in the moments of your life).
- 4. Keep a gratitude journal/list. (Writing it down often makes something more real to us. Gives it value).
- 5. Volunteer. (Do something for someone else with absolutely no expectation of getting something in return).
- 6. Express yourself. (Use your God given gifts as an act of expression).
- 7. Spend time with loved ones, (Show them you value them by giving them the one thing that you cannot buy back or replace time).
- 8. Find joy in many areas of your life, work, relationships, activities, family and faith. (Seeking ways to grow in all those places).

So, this series will not only remind you to live thankfully each day of your life in your homes, work, and schools, but it will also give us an opportunity to see how we might live thankfully in our faith life. How we might support the ministries and missions of the church that have been an active part of our faith journey. Remember, "Living a Thankful Life" is not about concentrating on what we can get, but rather about what we can give in an expression of gratitude for all God has done for us.





What do we need from YOU? **COOKIES, COOKIES AND MORE COOKIES!!**

We need many varieties of fresh-baked delicious cookies; good old-fashioned ones as well as fun new creations.

Details: All must be Homemade Goodies. (Fudge and Candies are also welcome) Each family is asked to commit to making a MINIMUM of 5 pounds (which should be about equivalent to a double or triple batch, maybe 4-5 dozen). They should be fresh baked that week. Cookies can be made by people individually or some work in teams at the church. We really need medium or smaller size, attractive cookies that have a little weight to them. Larger ones are fine if they are specialty...we often bag those individually or in small batches. Festive Christmas cookies are a big hit. We don't need too many of the ordinary cookies (plain chocolate chip, etc) no matter how delicious, they don't sell quite as well at these type of events, so although we still need them, we will limit the number of basic cookies. Please call the church or Beth Vickers (979-255-1406) to sign up and let us know what variety of cookies you are bringing (that way we don't have too many of the same kind!). We will need the cookies delivered to the church by Friday, December 10.

Also, if you would like to help as a hostess on the day of the event, please let us know!




