

I was at the state game ready to watch our team's bid for a three peat. As I was sitting there with the rest of us from Franklin, full of pride in our hometown and our kids, dressed in all kinds of uniforms: football, cheerleading, twirling, and band; I noticed the top running marque had "Jesus Gets Us"; it was surrounding the whole stadium. I wondered how many others noticed. Then I began to ponder.

How interesting it was running during the beginning of the game. And how appropriate, cause win or lose Jesus gets us all. He knew the high points of recognition when a voice from Heaven declared that this was God's beloved Son in whom God is well pleased. Later at the Transfiguration that same voice would make that declaration again and tell the disciples to listen to him.

But Jesus also knew the low points. He grieved when he heard that John the Baptist was beheaded. He wept when Lazarus was dead and buried. He struggled in the garden when the crucifixion was just hours away. He felt the pull of his own will even asking God if there was a way the cup could pass by him. But it was, as it was in the Passover, the blood of the lamb that would save the people of God. And this time not only for the first born but all those who believed in Jesus Christ as the only begotten Son of God the Father, who because of His great love for the world sent him into this world as a little baby wrapped in swaddling cloths. The past few months I've been in the process of seeking God about what to do when my current visa finishes up in March of 2024. As I've shared previously, I've had an open-ended commitment here and have put down roots and really felt like Newy has been home for me. But as I prayed, I felt God speaking to me about making a pretty big change **and here it is** -- in March I'll be heading to Oregon to complete a 3-month 'Foundations of Counseling Ministry' [FCM] school with YWAM Salem. Since my DTS in 2018 I've had interest in this YWAM course but had never felt to pursue it until these last several months. I've loved getting to work with youth and young people in mentorship roles but feel like there's more training and practice that I'd like to deepen to continue serving in areas like this in the future. I don't have a full picture of what will come next, but I've really felt God's loving hand in this process to do the course and trust that He will continue to direct my steps afterwards. All this means that I'll be finishing up here with YWAM Newy/Tahlee at the start of March, heading to Texas for a couple of weeks and then making my way to Oregon to start the course. I'm looking forward to this new change but also processing the
